Vision Statement

Mission Statement

We believe in play as the basis of the Early Childhood Curriculum. We see ourselves following the historical line of South Australian Kindergartens established by Lillian de Lissa, and hold to the original values of social justice and child-centered learning. We value reflective practice based on current research and International understandings with a continual responsiveness to community need. In assessing children's development, we program for the individual strengths and needs of each child and measure individual success in terms of distance travelled. We strive for a holistic approach to education and a flexible and creative environment. We aim to engage all children with their diverse learning styles, dispositions and a wide range of home languages. The visual presentation of our centre is colourful, multicultural, interesting and stimulating. We believe that children's engagement in learning also requires child voice, so sensitive listening, observation and recording are essential to our planning cycle. We place importance on wellbeing and recognise that the development of children's social skills, including self-esteem and empathy as well as other interpersonal skills, are central to their optimal development.
